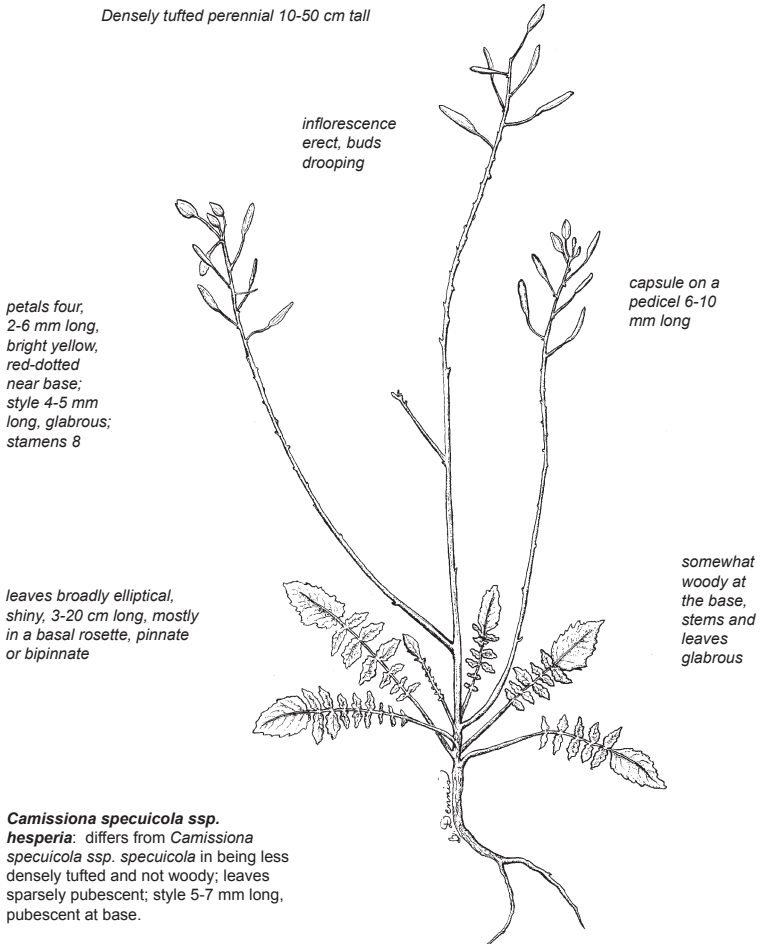


(No COMMON NAME)

Camissonia specuicola

ssp. specuicola

Densely tufted perennial 10-50 cm tall



Onagraceae (Evening-Primrose Family)

Phenology: flowering and fruiting all seasons except winter.

Management Responsibility: NPS (Grand Canyon NP), Havasupai Tribe, Hualapai Nation.

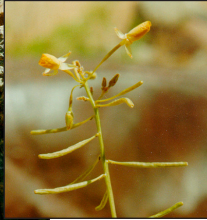
Similar Species: *C. walkeri* is an annual or short-lived perennial with pubescent leaves. *C. multijuga* has petals > 6 mm long, and the style is > 6 mm long and the stigma is elevated above the anthers, instead of surrounded by the anthers.

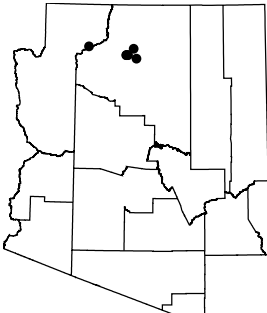

Habitat: *C. s. ssp. specuicola*: debris slides and crevices of broken Redwall Limestone, elevation 4,500-5,600 ft (1370-1710 m). *C. s. ssp. hesperia*: washes, dry stream beds, and gravelly or sandy Colorado River beaches, often on limestone substrates, elevation 1,200-3,500 ft (365-1070 m).

Range: *C. s. ssp. specuicola*: South Kaibab Trail, Grand Canyon NP in the Inner Canyon. *C. s. ssp. hesperia*: two disjunct populations along Colorado River: Havasu and Hualapai Canyons and from Separation Canyon to Spencer Canyon.
